SAM CUTLER 65 // AUTHOR

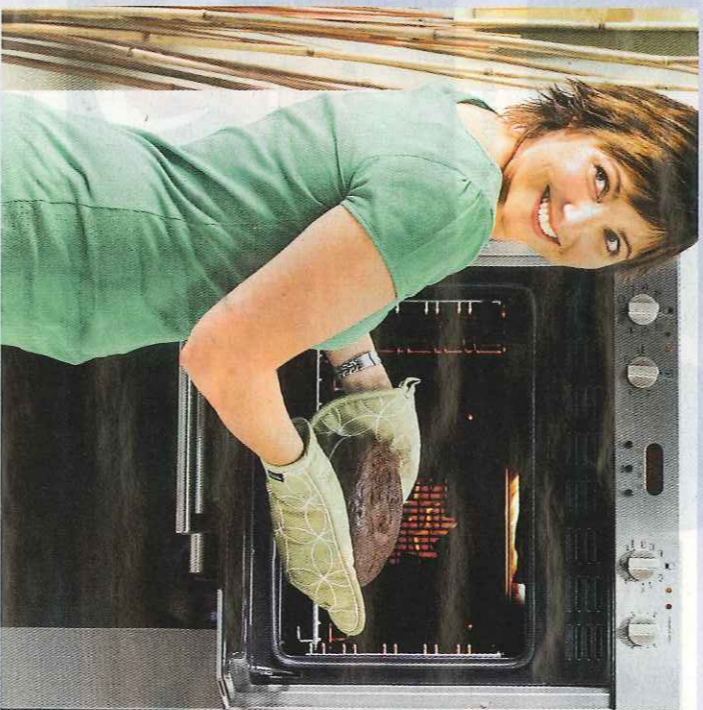
This is a photo of me with Mick Jagger when I was tour manager for the Rolling Stones in 1969. It was taken backstage at The Forum in Los Angeles, when the band was about to go on stage. That's always a pretty tense and exciting moment. It's a bit like a boxing match, everybody's pretty pumped.

I wanted to write [the book] *You Can't Always Get What You Want* in large part to set the historical record straight about the events at Alamont [when a man was killed by a Hell's Angel as the Rolling Stones played]. There's been a lot of nonsense written about the Rolling Stones and what it's like to look after the Rolling Stones. They're pretty normal, ordinary people; they're not monsters and they're not paragons of virtue, but I've not read anything by anyone that's really got it right. It's one thing to be looking from the outside in and another to be the band's actual tour manager.

I now live at The Gap – I moved to Australia because I have an Australian wife and I became an Australian in 2000. I always promised myself that when I was 60 I'd start writing. I've got five books to write and this is number three. I really wanted to write it myself, and not use a ghost writer – it's my voice and my story and I think people are going to love it.
